Year 8 End of Year Assessments

Year 8 students sit formal assessments in each of the subjects they study throughout the year. These assessments are taken during lesson time and in the classroom with their teacher. As a school we prioritise delivering appropriately timed feedback that focuses on moving learning forward. This document gives you a more detailed breakdown about the End of Year assessments that your child is currently working towards and resources to support them.
