We were also particularly grateful to Sophie for coming as she works as a full time nurse and had just completed a night shift. She also told us that she is writing a book with her story in it, with the help of another local history teacher Mr Lawrence, and we very much look forward to reading this too. Another speaker, Maralyn, shared her father's story with Year 10 and 11. It was inspiring to hear about how a spoon helped him to survive several camps, how he escaped the gas chambers, and his time in Lake Windermere after the Holocaust. Finally, Lesley spoke to Year 7, 8 and our Sixth Form, and was powerfully able to share the story of her family










Reading With Teens

Firstly, a Group round, where they had 40 minutes to work through 10 challenging questions either individually or helping each other. Next up was the Crossnumber round, in which the teams divided into pairs, one pair taking the across clues, the other pair working on the down clues - helping each other to fill out the entire grid. Lastly, the teams competed in the Shuttle round, where one pair's solution to a question was the other pair's input value for the next task. Our

We look forward to participating again next year!




Middlesex Cross Country Championships


Year 7 Food Tech



Rex Nettleford Essay Prize for Year 12 Students

We are pleased to share that the Rex Nettleford Essay Competition on Colonialism and its Legacies for year 12 students are now open for submissions from Year 12 students. The Rex Nettleford Essay Prizes are intended to encourage students to engage with the legacies of colonialism in all its forms — historical, political, social, cultural. As well as the competition, an annual lecture on 'Colonialism and its Legacies', takes place every Trinity Term. By writing an essay for the prize, a student has an opportunity to uncover the enduring influence of colonialism in our society and culture and to address some of the difficult and uncomfortable questions that it poses. The questions that will be explored during this year's competition are:

- 1. What role do the arts play in the creation or challenging of racialized hierarchies?
- 2. Pick an object that you think illuminates the legacies of colonialism, and explain why and how.
- 3. How long do the legacies of colonialism last?
- 4. "The truth is one and same, everywhere in the universe. Therefore, proposals to de-colonise academic curricula are wrong-headed." Discuss. The winning entry will receive a £250 prize which will be awarded at Oriel College on the occasion of the Rex Nettleford Lecture during Trinity Term 2023. Entries should be no more than 2,500 words in length, and the deadline for submissions is 12:00 on Friday 17th March 2023. For more information, please see the webpage linked above.




