It was a pleasure to welcome Year 9 students and their parents and carers to our 'Options Evening' event on Thursday night. Students were asking sensible questions and exploring the possibilities, and Year 9 now have a week to make their four option choices. Speaking to Year 9 students today, it sounds like many are quite confident in the four subjects they are going to choose; others, however, are still either uncertain or torn between a few possibilities. To try help guide final decisions, it might be helpful to have discussions with your child using the following questions to guide you:

Have you chosen any 'practical' subjects? Most students enjoy having at least one subject with a 'practical' element (e.g. – Drama, Music, Art, Photography, DT, Food Tech, Sports Studies) to vary the way they learn through the week.

Have you chosen any subjects with coursework elements? This can be beneficial in alleviating a little of the pressure that comes at the end of Year 11, due to lessening the number of exams you may have to sit.

Have you chosen the subject hoping for a specific teacher or to be in a class with certain friends? Neither of these things can be guaranteed, due to multiple classes and teachers of subjects. Make sure you choose subjects you enjoy and think you will do well in.

Mr Evans, Head of Year 9, also wanted to extend thank you to the student helpers we had on the evening, with a special mention given to the Y12 senior prefects for Year 9, Matthew and Siana, as well as Lottie (Y12) for their outstanding help. A big thank you also to all the parents and carers who were supportive of the evening.

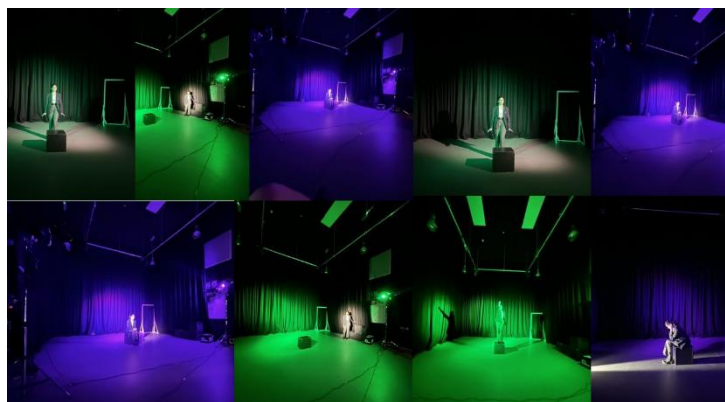
Literacy Fact

In makeup I wanted to focus on bruising around the face, arms and legs to show the past effects of self-harm due to her clinical depression and anger.

I am going to create a fake line of bruising/skin burning on her neck to show an attempt in suicide through hanging herself. This shows the level of severity in her corrosive thoughts and expressions.

I will also create dark circles to show sleep deprivation due to her depression and anxiety. Small details within the makeup design will reinforce the violent actions taken and immense impacts not just mentally but physically. This will create a more impactful piece making the audience feel a sense of worry and sympathy.

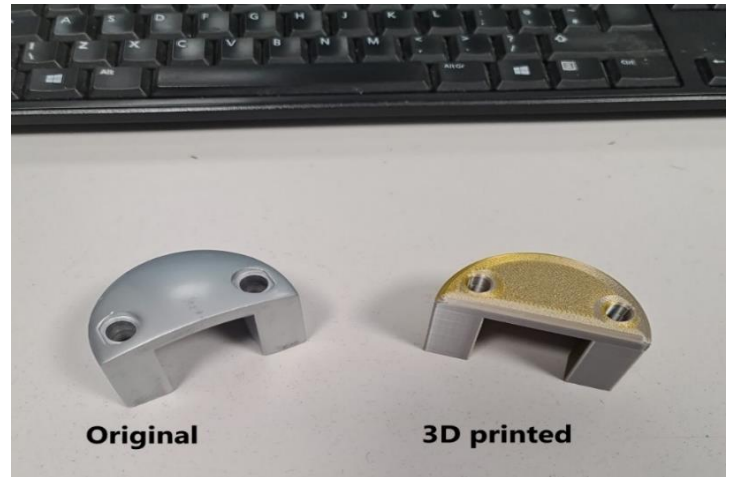
