Literacy Fact – PEA(Point, Evidence, Analyse)

When we are exploring a text, looking at the writer's craft and how meaning can be inferred, there are methods we can use to make our writing more organised and detailed. For example:

- Point: In chapter 5 of Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, we see that Frankenstein is fearful of his creation.
- Evidence: The narrator describes how he "escaped" and "rushed downstairs".

Analyse: Shelley's verb choices convey both a sense of urgency as well as implying that the creation is threatening and something to be feared.

Year 9 trip to Kempton Nature Reserve

On Wednesday, a group of Year 9 students visited Kempton Nature Reserve with Mr Evans and Ms Fletcher for the afternoon. We met Charlie and Christine who work for Thames Water, who guided us around the reserve and shared lots of interesting facts about the wildlife that can be found there. We saw many different species of bird including a Red Kite, Buzzard, House Sparrow, Greater Spotted Woodpecker, Fledgling Robin, Lapwing, Reed Bunting and a Heron, just to name a few. We were also very lucky to have heard a male Cuckoo bird. We learnt how to use the binoculars and cameras, which enhanced our experience for the day. Since Spring was in bloom, we heard and saw Marsh Frogs (in the picture attached) and six different species of butterfly. The sun was shining and it was a great way to be outdoors and experiencing nature, learning so many different facts about our local area. One more interesting fact that we learnt was about how the reserve is a home to six different species of bats. Mr Evans was quick to jump in and tell us as many scientific facts that he knew about bats, birds and the reserve.
