#### Year 8 Boys Rugby v Richmond upon Thames

The Year 8 boys got the academic year's busy fixture schedule underway with a rugby match against Richmond upon Thames, playing at home. Always a well-drilled side, the opposing team delivered one of the biggest defeats the Turing team suffered this time last year. However, on this occasion, there was just one try separating the two sides at half time. The narrow scoreline was a result of some excellent try saving tackles and plenty of line breaks. The visitors started the second half in a ferocious fashion as a couple of quick succession tries proved the difference at full time as the score finished 8 tries to five. Despite not getting the win, this was a huge improvement compared to their Year 7 performance - well done to all involved!

## Sports Clubs

Most sports clubs began this week with lots on offer for students to get involved with. Students simply need to turn up on the day of their desired club(s), get changed into their PE kit in the PE changing rooms and make their way to the location (field, sports hall, MUGA etc). Students will also need to self-register into the club via the Bromcom app once this is working for students. They can do this while changing. If a club begins before school, students should turn up in their PE kit and have their school uniform in their bag to change into for lesson 1. If a club is after school, then students do not need to get changed back into their school uniform (unlike PE lessons for those that have PE in lesson 6). Girls' rugby has been added to the list of sports clubs - this will take place every Wednesday after school beginning on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> September.
