Last week Turing House School hosted our annual Careers Fair on Thursday 18th April. We would like to thank all the brilliant speakers and presenters who volunteered their time to come along and talk to our students about future careers and next steps.

We were delighted to see so many of you this attend vear's which event, encompassed a wider range of careers from Medicine, Media, Construction, Law and Business plus many more. Several students and families commented on how useful they found the sessions and ability to



talk directly to exhibitors invaluable. Year 11 feedback after listening to Lucy Fyleman (NHS Doctor) and Barry Nixon (IT specialist) was 'it was a valuable insight into a future career and opened my eyes to the number of opportunities available in these fields'.



This year, we had several new colleges, including Strodes and Access Creative College (specialist media college). These were alongside Richmond Upon Thames and Kingston Colleges. Many students are now

starting to consider a wider array of post-16 qualifications, so it was great to hear such positive feedback on BTECs and, increasingly, T-Levels. Many of our local Universities were present, including some from further afield including Norwich and Southampton. As these are increasingly popular with our students post-18 it was good for parents as well as students to talk directly and gain advice on admissions.

There was quite a lot of interest in our Cybersecurity expert this year. Unfortunately, he was unable to attend at the last minute. However, I am pleased to announce he has offered to come to Turing House again to talk to students who are keen on a career in Cybersecurity and Cybercrime about his role and ways into the industry.
