#### Imperial War Museum visit



You will encourage children to have a voice, participate in group activities, to develop intellectual and social skills, and also encourage them to use various resources and experience a range of activities.

Short breaks provide support to young people who have a disability and live in the Kingston and Richmond boroughs. We run group sessions after school, weekends and holidays. We also provide support in the community on a one-to-one basis, plus assist young people in mainstream clubs to enable them to access those clubs. Groups use our centres as well as going out into the community for trips out. This is a Zero hours contract, however there is scope to build up regular hours within the service. 
