Literacy

PEA (Point, Evidence, Analyse)

When we are exploring a text, looking at the writer's craft and how meaning can be inferred, there are methods we can use to make our writing more organised and detailed. For example:

- Point: In chapter 5 of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein*, we see that Frankenstein is fearful of his creation.
- Evidence: The narrator describes how he "escaped" and "rushed downstairs".
- Analyse: Shelley's verb choices convey both a sense of urgency as well as implying that the creation is threatening and something to be feared.


