Numeracy Fact – Prime Numbers

A prime number is a number that has two factors (numbers that can divide into it), these being itself and 1. Therefore the number 1 is not a prime number as it only has one factor. The number 2 is the only even prime number.

Infinite Primes

Euclid proved that there are an infinite number of prime numbers. It's actually quite an easy proof to understand once you've seen it. Not easy to work out on your own though and he did this 2000 years ago.

Largest prime ever found

Mathematicians are still looking for larger and larger prime numbers. Even though the list is never ending it is interesting and useful to find ever bigger prime numbers. The record is currently held by $2^{74,207,281} - 1$ with 22,338,618 digits.

This number was found by the Great Internet Mersenne Prime Search (GIMPS) which currently offers a US \$3000 research discovery award for participants who download and run their free software and whose computer discovers a new Mersenne prime having fewer than 100 million digits.

Matchstick Maths


Arrange 8 matchsticks to form the fish swimming left as shown in the illustration.



The object of the puzzle is to move 3 matchsticks to make the


fish swimming in the opposite direction, i.e. to the right.

Food Hygiene Certificate


Our kitchen was inspected before halfterm and received the highest possible hygiene rating. Well

Jack Petchey Foundation. We are happy to say that we have now formed a partnership with them.

Jack Petchey offers an achievement scheme in which 9 students in an academic year can be given a Jack Petchey award.

"Young people selected are those who have gone above and beyond, and achieved — perhaps where others thought they might fail. Winning an Achievement Award should mean different things for different people—it may represent a personal triumph against adversity, it may recognise a young person who has pushed themselves outside of their comfort zone, it may be the opportunity to recognise the outstanding efforts of a team player who always puts others first. At the very heart of the Achievement Award is the fact that young people make the nominations and selections and so they are recognising the hard work and efforts of their peers."

This award comes with a certificate, badge and letter from Jack Petchey, and also an invitation to a twice yearly celebration event. Each student will then be given £250 to spend on something beneficial for the school.
