Learn to play a musical instrument

Next Thursday 15th September, we are holding an instrumental taster session with Richmond Music Trust who are our individual lesson providers. This is a wonderful opportunity to try different instruments which will hopefully inspire students to take one of them up. Those who already have lessons either with the Trust or privately, should bring their instruments in on that day so that we can have an instrumental session with them also. Information will be sent home with the students on the day detailing how they can apply for lessons.

Introducing



You may or may not be aware that we have our first school pet acquired as a rescue from the RSPCA. Our (as yet) unnamed bearded dragon is perfectly safe, with students being educated on care, handling and feeding. Students have been given this easy 7 part plan to ensure that everyone stays safe.

Step 1: Wash your hands – this helps to prevent you passing on any illnesses to me

Step 2: Approach me slowly – do not reach from above, I might interpret your reach as an attack. Do not interrupt me while I am eating. Do not back me into a corner, I will feel threatened. Do not tease me with your finger, I might think it's a worm and chomp!

Step 3: Pet my head – this helps me to feel comfortable. Once I have blinked you can pick me up.

Step 4: Holding me – Gently put your hand, palm upturned, under my body and scoop me up. Use your thumb and finger to support my front arms while my body rests in your palm. Make sure all my legs are supported. You could place a second hand under my tail as well.

Step 5: Getting comfortable - Place me on your arm, chest, or lap and I will most likely stay there comfortably while you pet me. Pet me along my scales.

Step 6: Putting me back – When I become restless it is time to put me back. Remember we are cold blooded so if my belly feels cold I need to be put back in my vivarium.

Step 7: Wash your hands after you touch me.

We have set the students a competition to name our bearded dragon with 'Beardy', 'Beardo Draggins' and 'Alan' being the first offerings.


Everyone can submit one name. The staff will choose the top 3 and the school will then vote for which name they would like from these three.
