

Exciting Opportunity for Tom D!

An exciting opportunity has opened up for Tom Delaney who currently attends Trinity College for Music on Saturdays as a junior.

Over half term, he was invited to take part in a joint project with Laban Dance School and composers Leo Geyer and Darren Bloom.

"With our Composers' Ensemble as the resident ensemble for this project, JT composers and CAT dancers will be working together to create a 25min show on the theme of 'Exchange' to be produced for Live@TL on the LABAN Main Stage and with some workshops taking place at TATE Exchange. This is an extraordinarily exciting collaboration, the likes of which haven't happened since Leo Geyer himself was at JT."

Tom spent 3 days over half term working with the other composers/dancers, and will be composing some short bits of music (only 1 min joining pieces!) as he is by far the youngest person on this project; most of them are A level students.

The performance for this will be Tues 20th March. It will be amazing for Tom to hear something he has written performed on stage by an orchestra and dancers.
