She told us that 1 in 9 people don't have access to clean water and that 1 in 3 people don't have a safe and accessible toilet! I learnt that many people around the world die from diseases and do not have access to clean water or safe toilets, and that if you do have these things you should be very grateful. I think we should be looking to support charities like Water Aid and help people who are still struggling and dying from terrible diseases because they are less fortunate. English at Turing House

A couple of examples of collaborative essays from Year

9 students studying To Kill a Mockingbird. Students had to plan and write an essay on innocence and justice in the novel. The class produced excellent some pieces of work, all in preparation for their upcoming literature



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STEM Club

Previously in STEM club, students used copper sheets to make copper envelopes and oxidise them by heating (when heated copper glows bright red) using a Bunsen burner. Students completed the practical successfully and observed that when copper is heated a layer of black copper oxide forms on its surface as copper reacts with the oxygen in the air.

However, inside the envelope, copper maintains its original colour. This is because copper, like many transition metals, reacts very slowly with oxygen in the air but when heated the same reaction happens much faster.
