<u>Task 1 – Create a political scrapbook</u>

- Buy one newspaper every week, make it a different paper each week so that you can compare and contrast
- Use this paper to create a scrapbook of the big political stories this summer
- It might be best to buy a Sunday paper so that you have an overview of the week
- The types of stories you might want to scrapbook could be:
 - The UK government's response to Covid 19 compared with other nations
 - The criticism the UK government will face in response to their Covid
 19 strategy
 - The strategies the government is using to reboot the economy postlockdown
 - o The US presidential election (keep an eye on this one!)
 - o The EU's response to Covid
 - o Black Lives Matter and the government response to protests
 - o Potential legislation as a result of Black Lives Matter
 - o Any other political stories of interest you never know when a big scandal may break!
- Overall, you should have six weeks of political stories to scrapbook
- Be as creative and colourful as you can with your scrapbook use colour, illustration etc
