<u>2015</u>

In 2015 Turing House School was set up, with only a Year 7 cohort at first. As the school grew, alongside our History GCSE we began to offer AS Politics as a KS4 option for some of our more able students.



<u>2020</u>

In 2020 our first cohort sat their History GCSEs and AS Politics qualifications, and we opened our Sixth Form, offering A-Level History and Politics for the first time.



<u>2022</u>

In 2022 we moved to our new site at Whitton, with state of the art facilities, and our students sat their first ever A-Level examinations, gaining wonderful results.



<u>2023</u>

In 2023 we introduced a new GCSE course in Citizenship and Politics. We also trialled teaching a lesson of Politics for Year 9 students. History continued to thrive, being one of the most popular GCSE and A-Level options.

The History and Politics department is very much a team. We meet regularly as a department to develop our teaching, share best practice, and to support each other.


